#### **New Constitution for VALID**

On Friday 18 November 2022, VALID held a Special General Meeting for members at which a new Constitution for our Association was considered and adopted. The new Constitution retains VALID's name, purposes and other key features including a majority of the governance body having to be people with a disability, or family members / carers of people with a disability.

The changes it introduces include having a Board instead of a Committee of Management, having only nine members of the Board (instead of up to 16 Committee members) and new terms (3 years) and limits (maximum of 9 years) for elected Board members. The previous five office bearer positions will be simplified to just two - Chair and Deputy Chair. The new Constitution also changes the member categories to governing members (Board members) and associate members (individuals and organisations supporting VALID's aims).

VALID's 2022 AGM will now be held on Friday 9 December at 11.00am, in accordance with the new Constitution.
